Prairie View A&M University President to Give Keynote at the 2012 Central Texas DiversityFIRST™ Awards Luncheon in October

The Texas Diversity Council will recognize 5 Central Texas individuals and 4 organizations for their contributions at the DiversityFIRST™ Awards Luncheon from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The Individual DiversityFIRST™ Leadership Award is awarded annually to individuals who demonstrate outstanding accomplishments in the promotion and advancement of diversity through inclusion and strong leadership in the areas of workforce diversity, supplier diversity, multicultural outreach and community involvement.

The Corporate DiversityFIRST™ Leadership Award goes to businesses, corporations or organizations that have a diversified work force; visionary and insightful leadership to confront and resolve inequities; outreach to multiracial and multicultural populations; organizational commitment to the recruitment and retention of underrepresented populations; diversity initiatives that foster a more inclusive and equitable work and learning environment; and continued corporate community involvement.
